#### Mobile Apps: Tracking from your phone or device


Mobile apps have improved vehicle tracking by providing constant access to your vehicles from your smartphone or tablet. You can leverage this technology in many ways, depending on the capabilities of your vehicle tracking provider's app.

The Quartix mobile app gives you access to a live map, letting you see where each vehicle is in real time. If you want to go back to another date, you can also view each vehicle's route history.



Mobile apps can also let you track how your drivers are performing, allowing you to see things like excessive speeding or harsh braking without having to log on to a computer. If you spot any risky driving on the mobile app, you can address it right away.

Some apps, like Quartix's, even let you and your drivers mark trips as business or personal on the app itself, making recordkeeping and mileage reimbursements much easier.



# Scheduled Reports: Get the info you need sent to your inbox



You can keep an eye on your vehicles' activities using your vehicle tracking reports, from live tracking and out-of-hours use, to driver management. But if you are out on the road or at a job site, you might not be able to log on to your computer and pull up these reports.

Many platforms, Quartix included, allow you to set up automated or scheduled reports to get the information you need. These reports are sent directly to the email addresses of your choice either daily, weekly, or monthly, depending on your needs. This means you don't have to constantly check your tracking system to stay updated. Naming the locations your vehicles frequent with custom labels makes reading those reports even easier

These reports can include vital information like maintenance reminders, highlighting upcoming deadlines for routine servicing, so you can ensure your vehicles are always running in optimal condition.


By having these reports sent to your email, you save time and always know what's going on with your vehicles, even when you're busy.

## Geofencing: Know when your vehicles cross certain boundaries

Geofencing is a useful tool that lets you set up virtual boundaries around specific areas and designate those areas as prohibited or mandatory at times of your choosing.

For example, you could draw a geofence around your company's office and establish it as a mandatory zone outside of work hours. This means that if your vehicles aren't in that area after hours or if they are moved outside of office hours, you will be notified right away.

There's no need to log on to check if your vehicles have violated any of your established location rules as these alerts can be sent to your email or even set up to come through as an SMS message.
